

# Destinations data for Millthorpe School

- Every year we are sent destination data from City of York Council. This information is requested by the Department for Education but shared with schools as well. The latest data we have is for the cohort of students who left in June 2021.
- The data tells us which education, training or apprenticeship setting each student moved on to once they left Millthorpe. We can use this information to evaluate our careers programme – are we giving the right advice to our students about their next steps?

These are the three year trends for Millthorpe School, measured against all York secondary schools.
