4. **Feedback:** Following the completion of the PPEs, students will receive detailed feedback. This feedback will highlight their strengths and areas for improvement, enabling them to reflect on their performance and make necessary adjustments to their study approach before the final examinations.
5. **Access arrangements:** For those students who qualify for access arrangements due to additional needs. The Inclusion team will write to you to confirm your child's arrangements within the next few weeks.
6. **Maintaining Balance:** While the PPEs are undoubtedly important, it's essential for students to maintain a balance between their academic responsibilities and their overall well-being. Encourage your child to prioritise self-care and wellbeing activities.
