Consent Required

Dear parent/carer,

You may be aware that historically, when students are in Year 11, they are rewarded with the privilege of going off site for lunchtime for consistently demonstrating gold standard learning. We aim to run this in the autumn, with a review at the end of the first term.

In order for students to get the privilege of a lunch pass, the following criteria will be considered:

- Learning conduct
- Attendance
- Attendance to intervention
- Punctuality to school and lessons
- Uniform

Students will be able to leave school for their lunch break after the first round of learning conduct, which usually takes place in Week Five of the new academic year.

If students are issued a lunch pass, they must have it on their person in order to be allowed out for lunch. This is for safeguarding purposes, as it allows us to scan their pass as they leave so we know who has left site at lunchtime. If a student forgets or loses their lunch pass, they will not be allowed to leave during lunch that day and must instead remain in school.

It is imperative that when students are off site at lunchtime, they are responsible in the community and respectful towards the public, both in local shops and on pavements or in communal areas. They must be back in school by 2.05pm and be on time, ready to learn for their final lesson of the day which commences at 2.15pm. Behaviour in the community that does not meet our expectations will result in the removal of the lunch pass, as well as other sanctions if appropriate.

If a small number of students have not earnt their lunch pass, support and interventions will be provided to try and allow them to earn it by meeting agreed targets.
